The collection had some very unusual cars, as the owner of the museum arranged with some car owners to store their cars in the museum while on display as part of the collection.



On Sunday morning, we toured the Ringling Museum. A wonderful sight, the "home" was a mere 35,000 square feet. Situated right on the bay, life was good to the families housed there. The dock would have housed a small 150 foot yacht. John and Mabel Ringling travelled to the towns where the circus was playing in their private train car, which had servants, a kitchen several sitting rooms and bedrooms.

John Ringling was reputed to be the fifth wealthiest man in the United States when he s bought an estimated 67,000 acres of what is now Sarasota and Longboat Key as investment property.

In the spirit of America's wealthiest Gilded Age industrialists, John Ringling gradually acquired a significant art collection, including paintings by Peter Paul Rubens, Velàzquez, Poussin, van Dyck and other Baroque masters, as well as rare antiquities from Cyprus. He built a palace for his treasures in a 21-gallery Museum of Art on his Sarasota property.

The Circus Museum's Tibbals
Learning Center houses an
exhibition of circus posters.
Ranging in size from window
to barn sized, these colorful
posters were plastered on
buildings, walls and fences
all across America and broadcasted in no uncertain terms
that the circus was coming to
town. The cornerstone of the
Circus Museum is The How-



ard Bros. Circus Model. The model is a replica of Ringling Bros. and Barnum & Bailey Circus from 1919 – 1938. It was created over a period of more than 50-years by master model builder and philanthropist Howard Tibbals




Santa in Peter & Gina Starr's 1956
