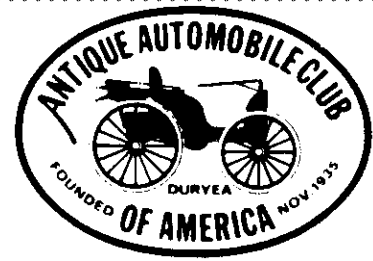



car show participation but other club functions that you are willing to carry out to keep our club viable and fun for all.

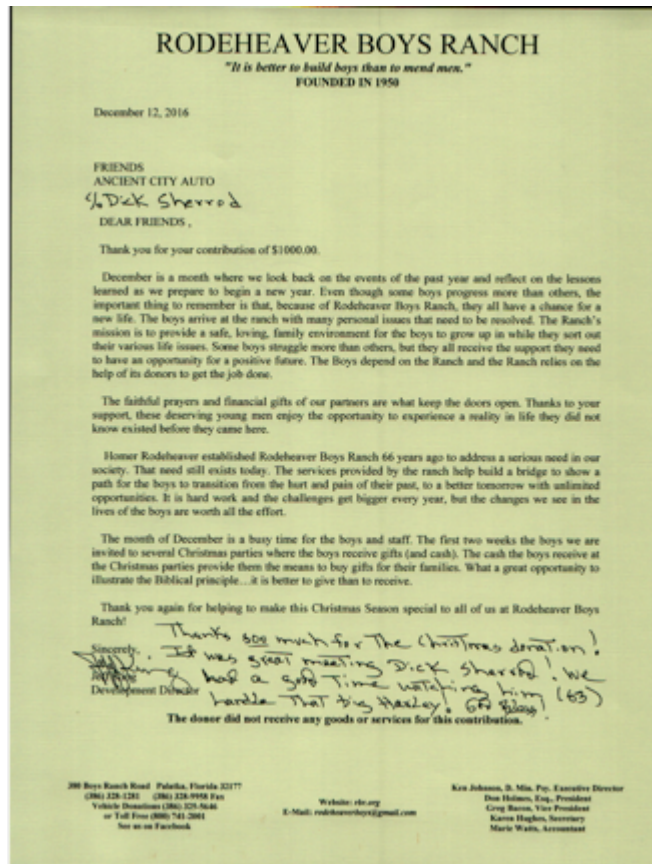

I call your attention to an article that follows in this issue by Dewey Porter who is not only the best we have for both classifying and judging, he takes his job very seriously with much pride. He discussed a complaint with me that he received concerning an alleged miss classification resulting in an unfair award. Audit of Car Show Judging ACAC Nov 19, 2016

One of our members discussed with me some concerns. She said "several members had expressed complaints that our Classes were not fair and judging was not fair". The specific example used was that a \$100,000 original Cobra was not judged fairly and in fact had lost out to a PT Cruiser. Naturally this upset me and I told her I would review the judging and respond.

The complaint proved to be incorrect I am happy to report.

The Cobra was not an original but in fact was a replica and correctly placed in Class 34 Kit & Modified. There were 5 cars in the class and the Cobra was judged in 5th place so no award. It did not lose out to a PT Cruiser as there was not a PT Cruiser in the class, as the one PT Cruiser in the show was correctly assigned to Class 28 Modified all makes 79 to Present and it won a third place award, not a first.

After reviewing all 37 Classes, all 199 entries, these are the facts.

Seven entries were assigned and judged in the wrong class. That is a 97% correct assignment which is admirable under stressful conditions and a 3 hour (8 AM – 11 AM) time limit.

The seven errors were; **1** Class 7 59-68 All Other: Entry 177 67 Chev Malibu won 3rd place. It should have been in Class 6 59-7 68 GM. **2** Class 6 59-68 GM Entry 180 63 Plymouth Convert won a 3rd place. It should have been in Class 7 where it would have won a 2nd. **3** Class 11 89 – Present All Makes Entry 86 an 89 Mustang GT should have been in Class 12 Mustang and Thunderbird All Years. It would not win an award in either Class **4** Class 3 32 & Older All Makes Wellington Morton's 33 Rolls Royce should have been in Class 1 as it had a CCA award marked on his entry sheet. The change would have moved David Gillispie's 39 Rolls Royce from 2nd to 1st **5** The 63 Austin Healy which won 3rd place in Class 3 should have been in Class 19 British cars. **6** The 66 Sunbeam which did not win in Class 3 should have been in Class 19 British cars. **7** Class 21 72 to Present Foreign Entry 141 a 2004 Jaguar should have been in Class 19 British cars.

FURTHER THOUGHTS

Why don't we get more Antiques ? Is there any way we could get more of the old cars. The Volusia AACA show which follows ours by a week gets mostly antiques, pre 1960 but then they give most of the awards to their own members. We had two antique classes this year. Class 2 1932 and Older we got no entries Where are the Model T's and Model A's; and Class 3 1933 to 1948 we got 2 which were both Military jeeps.

We get virtually no support from the nearby AACA Regions. Volusia, NE Fla (Jax), Azalea, Kingdom of The Sun (Ocala) The Villages, Cape Canaveral, Wheels in Motion, also The Crankin A's(Ormond) Model A Ford Club, MG Club. In the past all of these clubs have given us good support. Why don't they come anymore?

Class 12 Mustangs & Thunderbirds-All years we got 14 entries and split the class. Entry 182 John Sprouse marked his entry sheet AACA National Award. If true he should have been Class 1 but I did not see an award badge on his car so tend to think he did not have one.

Not quite as many Corvettes this year, perhaps there was a competing show. We had 6 classes for Stock Corvettes and had 33 entries so still a good turnout.

Class 19 British All years was the biggest class with 21 entries. We split the class.

Class 22 Trucks All Years we had 9 entries with a 2016 taking first. A 1978 lil Red Express Truck with only 26,000 miles took second. A 38 year old truck against a new one, hardly fair. Next year maybe 2 classes ?

I would like to see judge's name on judging sheet

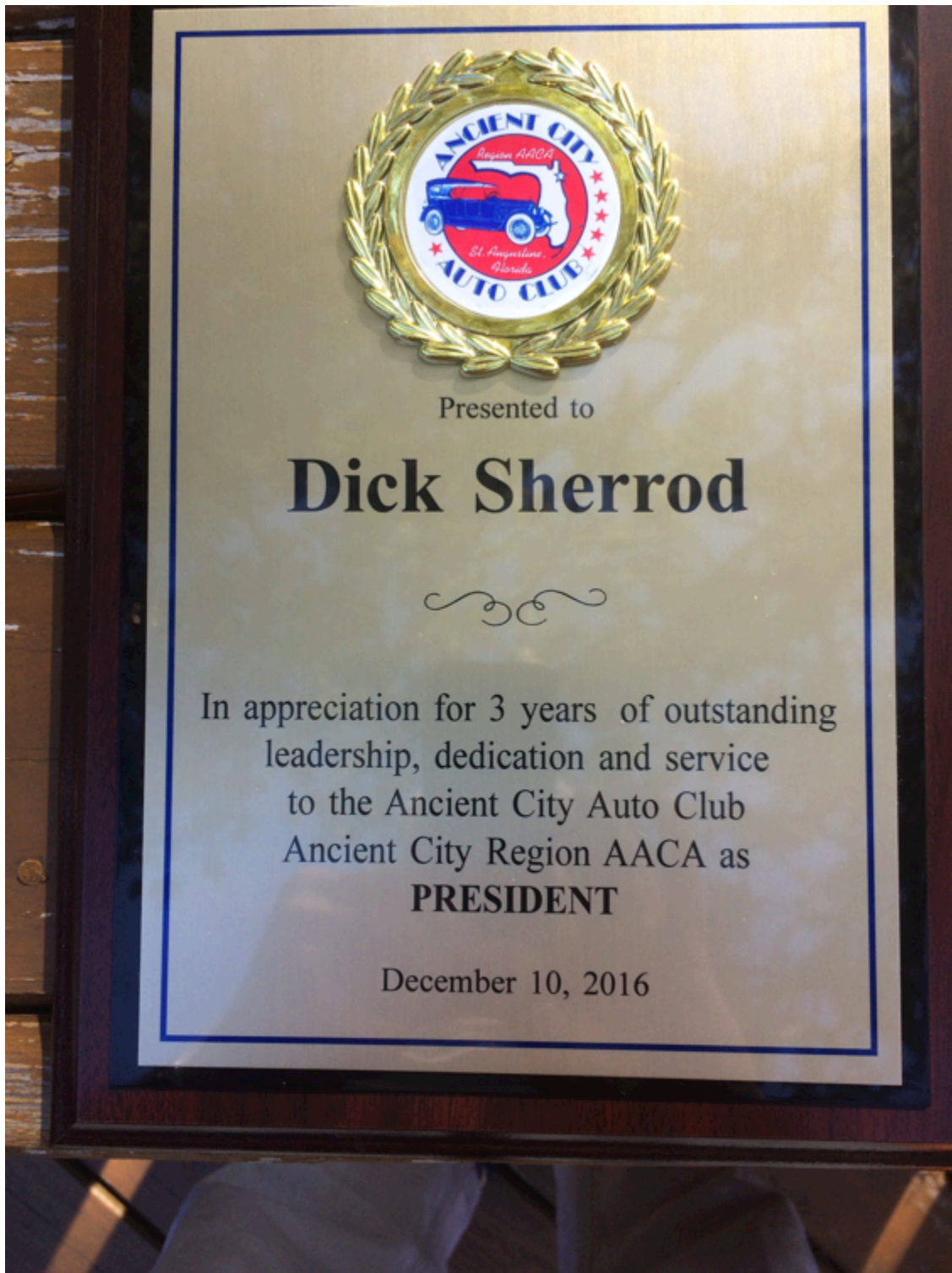
Class 30 Modified Corvettes 97 to Present showed 2 entries but only 1 judging sheet in file. Perhaps a no show ?

Class 31 Modified 54 and Older trucks showed 4 entries but had 5 judging sheets ?

Class 32 Modified trucks 55 – Present had 3 entries. Entry nbr192 Tom King 56 Ford pickup won 2nd place. Judging sheet had written on it "owes entry fee".

Class 36 Modified Mustangs All had 3 entries. James Stoddard entry sheet had no info, no entry nbr, no address. Did he even pay entry fee ?
