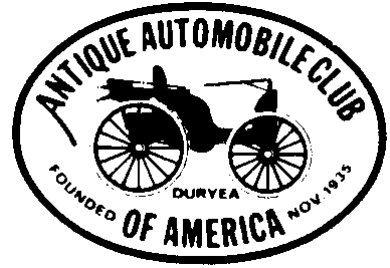

Several dozen vehicles joined the parade, each saying hello as they passed with Dewey greeting each by name. The lead car was particularly significant with Sidney driving his Willys-Knight, a car that was previously owned by Dewey. It certainly brought back memories. Just prior to the caravan arriving, more than a dozen neighbors arrived and sang happy birthday to our favorite 92-year-old. To say the least, Dewey was both honored and impressed. A special board meeting was called to replace Dewey as President of ACAC

Minutes of the ACAC board meeting, September 14, 2022

We convened a special session of the board in order to address a vacancy to the board. Our president Dewey Porter has decided the requirements of the job are a bit too strenuous for his present health condition. Although he describes his condition as okay, he is not up to accomplishing the daily tasks of the office of President and has asked to be relieved.

Vice President Joe Greeves convened the meeting at 7 PM with Fred Cooper, Treasurer, John Bagg, Newsletter Editor, and Doug Hunsworth. The minutes of the previous board meeting were referenced and approved as published.

According to our articles of association, a vacancy in office during the year will be filled by appointment from the executive board with confirmation of the membership by majority vote of those attending any regular membership meeting.

A motion was made and approved to appoint Joe Greeves as President, Doug Hunsworth as Vice President, with Fred Cooper, Bob Kessler, and John Bagg retaining their elected positions. The slate of officers will need to be voted upon at the next monthly meeting, held at the Village Inn on October 6. It should be noted that Dewey Porter is still a lifetime board member in accordance with his status as charter member. He will participate at whatever level is appropriate for his condition.

Banking requirements were addressed, and a motion was made by Fred Cooper to accomplish the following steps with the SouthState Bank regarding the club's checking account, account number 1028744.

1. Based upon his resignation, remove Dwayne Porter from the signature authority at the bank.
2. Add additional club officers to the signature authority at the bank. These additional officers are Joseph Greeves - President, and Doug Hunsworth - Vice President. The current Treasurer, Frederick B Cooper, will remain on the signature authority at the bank. These three officers have the authority to accept deposits and to sign checks in payment of club debts or obligations.
3. The official mailing address for the club's account will be changed to the mailing address for the Treasurer, which is 260 Deportivo Drive, St. Augustine, FL 32086.
4. The current Treasurer, Frederick B Cooper, is authorized to work with SouthState Bank to accomplish the changes indicated above.

The motion was approved by the board.

A copy of these minutes will be forwarded to the Antique Automobile Club of America and will be used if necessary to establish changes at the SouthState Bank. Fred Cooper will prepare the new slate of officers and forward them to AACA.

The board members were united in their respect and admiration for our longtime friend Dewey Porter, a consummate enthusiast who has spent the last 40 years enjoying the camaraderie of the Ancient City Auto Club members. We wish him a speedy recovery and look forward to his input and guidance as the club's founder and corporate memory.

Having no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 7:40 P.M.

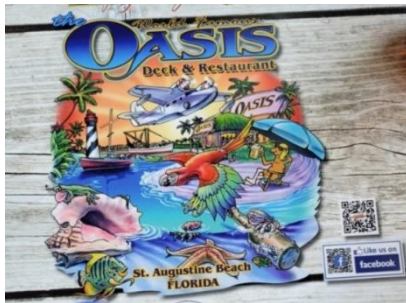
Minutes of the Ancient City Auto Club Monthly Meeting

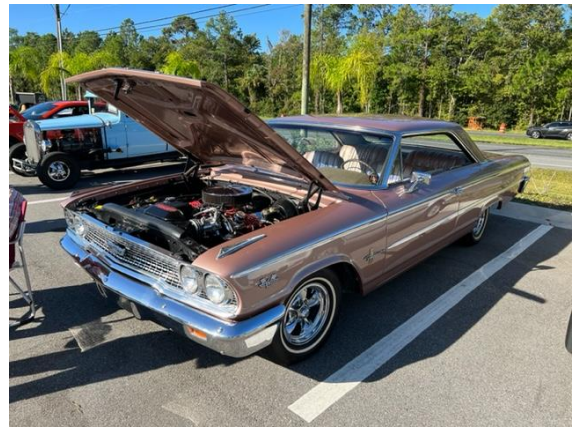
