
Jennifer Steinberger came with Cyrano de Bergerac but posed with Dick Sherrod. Was she Roxane?

Forgot about four trucks I had. Here they are:

A car salesman and a good friend of mine called me about an early Ford Bronco 4X4 he took in trade. It was a big two door with the removable rear cap and a gorgeous 3-tone black, gray, white and a red accent stripe. It had less than 20k miles on it and was owned by an elderly couple who towed it behind their monster motor home.

Overseas - while in "the bush", our vehicles of choice were usually Mitsubishi Monteros - the big ones. They would go places no one in his right mind should be in and the only other vehicle seen out there would be a Toyota Land Cruiser. So when this

super zoomy Montero LS 4X4 luxo barge became available - yep, had to have it. It was a bullet proof truck with an independently sprung and hydraulic cylinder suspended drivers seat that could be adjusted or locked down to the chassis like a conventional seat. Like the Toyota Land Cruisers, and 4Runners, these vehicles were built for the global market and designed to run in isolated locations where there were no dealers, no parts, no nothing. And it did. Unfortunately they don't import them here anymore. People just never took to the tall boxy style.

Last but not least, 2 4X4
Toyota 4Runners made it into my
driveway here in St. Augustine,
a 93 SR5 with a 3-litre V6 which
was a pure Toyota truck, and an 03
V8 Limited with every option
on the list. The latter was an
incredible vehicle in that it had
all the Toyota 4X4 muscle, but
drove like a limo and handled like
a sports car.

While I'm at it, We had a couple of late 80s Mercedes Benz 300TD turbocharged diesel wagons. They were tanks that seemingly would last forever. A favorite hot rod trick was to pour some ATF in the tank that would not only clean out the injectors but give performance a real boost. But while on the subject of Mercedes Benz, a bright red six cylinder 250C followed me home once.

What a great and stylish car it was.

Angela fell in love with the PT Cruiser when it hit the market. We bought a new bright red with chrome wheels 02 Limited through her cousin at cost who worked at a Chrysler dealership. I must

admit, the beast would carry an unbelievable amount of cargo with the rear seats out. She never forgave me for selling it so I went on the hunt for another determined to find a low mileage 06 GT version, the last year of the 230hp turbo 4 motor. 
