The Lakeland Show By Helen and Jim Salanitri

The Hancock Classic Road Tour was scheduled for Sunday October 21st with registered entrants enjoying a morning drive through Central Florida's countryside between 45 - 60 miles. This event was open to *All* types of vehicles culminating with lunch and prizes.

As October rolled in, so did my new Grandson "Luca". So, a trip to NY was scheduled giving me some family time with Luca, my son James, his wife and new mom, Bri and my three daughters, Danielle, Dana, and Krista, "The New Aunts". Time goes quick when you're having fun but time also waits for no one. Back to St. Augustine, late on the 16th, with only a few day's to prepare for the Lakeland trip, as most car guys know the same feeling "Do I have everything I need?" After some heavy rains on Friday the 19th, Ron and I were able to load my Corvette in the trailer and also my tow vehicle for an early 5:00am departure Saturday morning.

We had Jim and Rita Arpaia, Bill Soman, Tony Evangelista, Danny Stevens, Cliff Williams, Cliff Jr. and son Kyle car pooling, but due to our 8:00- 8:30 am staging window Ron and I had to leave earlier.



Arrival & Staging

Arriving at Lake Mirror at 7:45am, after following the pre-mailed maps, we located our staging gate # 17, unloaded car and was directed by no less than six (6) flag men to our (078) parking spot. This was the beginning of a memorable day and an experience I'll never forget. Our location was on the high ground overlooking the main stage with Lake Mirror behind it and several one of a kind Mahogany Speed boats cruising the Lake gave such a surreal look of the beauty of Lake Mirror. The entire perimeter of the lake staged the most beautiful, historically important and rare vehicles I have ever seen at one time and at one



event. One particular car Ron and I came upon was a “1957 Cadillac Eldorado Biarritz” hardtop with a Serving Tray. I know if Bob Quackenbush was with us he would have a huge smile from ear to ear!

As we strolled around the lake it reminded me of a great restaurant, toasting with your favorite glass of wine, getting ready for your best meal to follow. The combination of the awesome fair grounds and outstanding vehicles presented was a testament to the skill and incredible organization of the many people who made this event possible.

The Lake Mirror Concours d’ Elegance was the featured event of the Mid-Florida Auto Show weekend. At 10:00 am both shows started with Lake Mirror’s Bagpiper leading a small contingency of Flag carriers across the main stage. A thirteen (13) year girl started belting out the Stars Spangled Banner with a voice far greater than her age. After introduction of several dignitaries and honored guests, the Judging commences for both shows.

The Mid Florida Auto Show took place on the streets of downtown Lakeland, accommodating over 750+ and Special Interest and Collector Cars of all types. Vehicles were displayed in groups of similar makes and models. All pre-registered Vehicles and special awards were held at the Mid-Florida Credit Union stage at 2:00 pm. The winning cars selected were based on merit by Special Awards Committee and presented Trophies. In addition, Sponsors presented Award Ribbons to their favorite vehicles which are equally interested in original, unrestored, and rare and unusual cars. Simultaneously, the judging started at 10:00 am with judges adorning their trademark straw hats.

Our club group arrived and had a few group photos taken by Cliff Jr. and son Kyle. We lucked out having our vehicle located by one of the few shade trees to be able to hide from the sun now and then. The judging not only started at 10:00 am but over “35,000” spectators attending this free community event started entering the show areas.

Ron and I took turns viewing the vehicles and rare unusual cars around Lake Mirror, taking photos along the way. When asking our club group what they thought of the Lakeland show it was unanimous response “*The Best Car Show I have ever attended!*”, “*The organization was just Outstanding*” which were my exact feelings. Around lunch time all the judging vehicles were given a lunch for two (2) carried by their waitresses in straw basket. It was just another creative part of the show that Amazed me!

As the judging took place, the main stage was bringing some rare and unusual cars to view and given a history and background about the car.

One in particular was a 1948 Ferrari I66 Spyder Corsa chassis #0161. The most expensive Ferrari worldwide, the first to ever enter the US brought by well known sportsman Briggs Cunningham which was to be raced in the US. The “I” in the series number signified an “Inter” Model that qualifies for both sports car racing and formula 2 races.

Judging Begins

As Ron and I returned to our area the judging for our section was taking place. Approximately ten (10) Corvette consisting of several 1963 Split Window Coups, one of which a Z06 Fuelie, Big break taking 1st Place, several 1964’s, a 1966 and two 1960’s including myself. I was fortunate to take 2nd Place and the other 1960 took 3rd.

Heading Home

Due to what Ron and I thought was a dead battery on my Expedition tow vehicle, we decided to make our exit back to our trailer and tow car. We quickly loaded up and while Ron was finishing up I searched for a

jump. I found a BMW crew existing and they were able to give us a jump start. Unfortunately, after a loud squeal and “Pop” I realized the Serpentine Belt blew thus no Cooling nor Power Steering. Blocking other trailers to load we made a quick decision to leave and hopefully find a repair shop close by. We ventured down South Florida Ave with the temperature gauge starting to rise when we spotted a Sunoco station and Firestone Tire Shop which we were able to pull in and shut down thought they were closed for the weekend. We decided to check the problem and found the A/C Compressor had seized, causing the Serpentine Belt to shed and burn up.



Ron befriended “Julie” the Sunoco station manager who not only knew the owners of Levy’s Firestone but their great reputation over 37 years. We tried renting a car but the only place was “Tampa Airport” at least 40 miles away. Our solution was to rent a small 10’ U-Haul truck just to make it home, and by 9:30 pm we were back in St. Augustine. We had to leave both trailer and Expedition behind but assured they would be safe for Julie has the police always by for fresh coffee.



Monday morning I was able to speak to Gloria who was the wife and co-owner of Levy’s Imperial Tire (Firestone). She was aware of our situation and had her top technician checked the problem and get an estimate on the repair. I gave the OK and was fortunate the facility specialized in full A/C service and repair. By late afternoon I was called that the repair was completed, road tested and ready for picking up.

Ron and I left at 5:00 am Tuesday morning to get ahead of the Orlando traffic on Route 4. It worked out and we sailed through, arriving early enough to have a sit-down breakfast. When we arrived at the Firestone facility we meet Gloria, her son and staff giving up a warm comfortable that most car people have with each other. Especially asking to see what's in the "Trailer".

As I took care of the bill, Ron opened up the trailer and the whole shop came out to check out the Corvette tucked inside. Again, it's all about Car guys and girls who appreciate the hobby and have such a bond for the sport.



Relatively, a new club member and getting familiar with the various car shows and club special events, many of our club members spoke highly of the Lake land Auto Show as a "Must" attend. I submitted the required application and received an invitation on August 30, 2018 to participate in the Lake Mirror Concours de Elegance October 20, 2018.

The Show was a three-day event starting on Friday, October 19th with a VIP welcome reception. Unfortunately, due to restraints, we did not attend. The Mid-Florida Auto Show and Lake Mirror Concours were both scheduled for October 20 with an amazing display of more than 750 show vehicles throughout the downtown streets and surrounding the 1920 Art Deco inspired Lake Mirror Promenade now in its 19th year.




